Applicants must be MBA and have completed core coursework successfully to enroll in elective classes. Minimum 2 years

Full-time Workload: Please note that the courseload for exchange students is 4

MBA electives. Upon the request of partner schools, it will be possible to take a minimum of 3 MBA electives or a maximum of 5. It will not be possible to take a courseload outside this range. Exchange students will choose electives through a bidding system and changes to courses are not permitted once the bidding system application has closed. We ask that partner schools requiring that their students bid for certain courses

approve these requests before bidding takes place.

Learning Expectations: ESADE MBA courses are highly participative. Some classes are

case study-based, others on quantitative models, etc. The overall philosophy is cooperative and team-work oriented and we expect exchange students to collaborate as and when

required with groupwork.

condition.
