Health Insurance

- Must have Health Insurance with coverage
 - \$50,000 for each incident with less than \$500 deductible
 - at least 75% of hospital and physician costs
 - cost of Medical Evacuation and Repatriation of Remains
- Premium is about \$100 for 6-8 weeks

VISA

- Apply for Student's VISA with I-20 issued by UC Berkeley
- Cannot use Tourist's VISA
- Must let me know if you will be exchange students in the USA right after Summer 2017

- Group Flight--same departure flight to be determined for each session
- Airport Transportation--provided only for group flights
